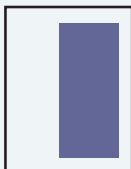

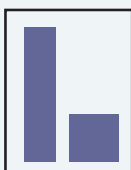

REST AND RECUPERATION (R&R) TRAVEL

R&R travel paid by the government includes employees and eligible family members. The Federal government is required to pay R&R and is limited to:

- (1) One round trip during any continuous two-year period of service unbroken by home leave; and
 - (2) Two round trips during any continuous three-year period of service unbroken by home leave.
- (3 *FAM 3722*)

Employees and eligible family members have the option of traveling anywhere within the United States (the 50 states and the District of Columbia) for R&R in lieu of traveling to the post's designated relief point abroad. If this option is selected, employees may travel directly to their selected United States city utilizing round-trip contract fares (3 *FAM 3725.3-2*) Paid by the federal government. **Required to spend over half the total scheduled leave in the U.S.** (Source: *U.S. Dept. of State Foreign Affairs Manual Volume 3 - Personnel*)
